

Anki Quick Start Guide

Thank you for downloading our 12 irregular verbs Anki deck resource and PDF.

If this is your first time using Anki no problem we wanted to help guide you through how to upload and use this simple program in a few simple steps.

If you are familiar with this program then you can go ahead and upload the deck and get started using it, if not continue reading.

Step 1: Download Anki

If you don't have Anki Deck then click the link below and it will take you directly to the page and you can download it from there.

It's fairly simple to download just choose which OS your using Mac or PC and the rest is history.

Step 2: import the file

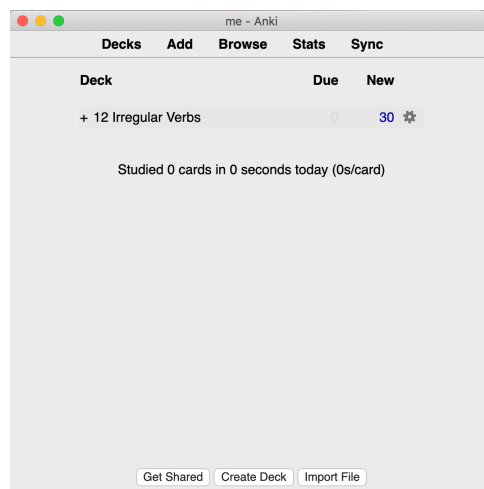
Alright you should have the file handy.

Open up anki and click on the tab that says **file** and locate the tab **import**

Once the window is open choose the Anki resource we provided and *wallah* you now have a complete deck ready and able to use

Step 3: use the deck

After your deck is imported you should have a screen something like the image below



So there are a few options that you can do to customize how many words you want to learn in a day.

The default is around I believe 20 so if that works for you just hit the specific deck, it will then open up another window and then press the **“study now”** button and your good to go.

You can also select a specific sub deck from the main deck if you want to just study a specific word your having trouble with.

Tips and Tricks


Increase the amount number of cards to study in a day

If you want to customize the deck a little for more study time here are a few things you can do...

After you have selected the desired deck you want to study you should see an option that says custom study, click that and it will open another window with the few options presented.

The first option should be to increase the limit amount and you can choose how many more cards you want to add from the selector below.


Study by state or tag

Another great feature that Anki offers is to study by a selected tag.

We have taken the liberty to categorize our decks by tags.

For example if you wanted to only study all the irregular verbs present tense you can select **“study by card or tag”** option and then in the option filter select the **“present”** tag and click ok.
